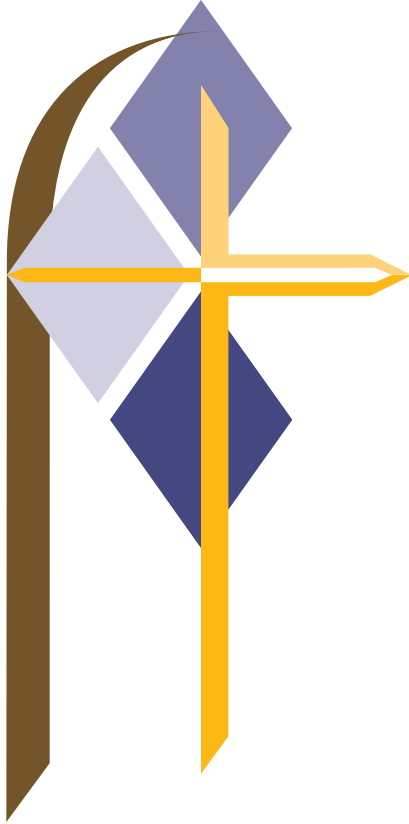

Yes, You!

Exodus 1-6

What do you think God would like to have happen in the world today? The classic beauty pageant answer goes something like, "God would like all of us to get along." The hyper-conservative response to the question might be, "For all the sinners to stop sinning." "Liberals" quite possibly would argue that God would love to see "the oppressed go free." For whatever reason, however, God in his wisdom chooses not to overwhelm history by instantly bringing any of these fine answers to fruition.

One reply, that might actually be the easiest to defend and tragically the easiest to set aside, involves you. Yes, you! You might ask what you have to do with things like world peace, global holiness, and overcoming injustices. After all, you're a mom, dad, business person, firefighter, plumber, insurance agent, orthopedic surgeon, student, retiree. Your calendar already lacks the necessary hours for you to complete what you want to have happen in your world today. Between commuting, shopping, exercising, e-mailing, strategizing, digging, bandaging, eating, and sleeping there is rarely a free moment.

Additionally, it's not like you're imbued with superhuman powers. The problems of this world are complex, deep-rooted, and widespread. All the kings of the world with all their forces couldn't put the world right even if they tried. Besides, your mind is already preoccupied with the stresses and strains of everyday life. If you're able to keep the checkbook balanced, mail your taxes on time, remember to water the lawn, and keep your house clean, haven't you've done enough?!

It seems that from God's perspective, no. What would God like to have happen today? Throughout the Bible, the answer is the same. God would like you to trust him. It can be said a number of ways: God would like you to be faithful. God would like you to depend on him. God would like you to live for him. God would like you to follow him. God would like you to walk with him. God would like you to love him. It's all the same. God would love to see you embrace him and in doing so to embrace his priorities and make them your own.

How will this solve geopolitical, socioeconomic, inter-racial, poly-religious, cross-cultural issues of justice and violence and poverty? Who knows?! There was a time, however, when God's people were living as slaves under brutal oppression. God's plan to deliver them from this life of misery was to send a less than enthused shepherd, who was living in self-imposed exile due to personal wrestlings with anger, violence, and integrity and a basic fear of being caught by officials for a crime he had committed. Yet when God tapped Moses for the role of deliverer, Moses' job was simply going and speaking. It was God who worked out the rest.

Whether you know it or not, God has tapped each of us to be faithful, too. We might wonder what a short prayer could accomplish or what a word about Jesus spoken out loud would produce. We might cynically see an act of kindness as a waste of energy which ends up being under-appreciated by others. God, however, sees our little acts of faithfulness as worship and as the very thing he would like to see in the world today.
