Psalm 14

Luke 15:1-10

- As a group re-read the scripture
- Name something you’ve lost.
  - Did you find it?
  - If not, what did you do about it?
- When Jesus was brought before him, Pontius Pilot asked Him, “What is truth?”
  - What do you believe is truth?
  - What do you believe is the truth about God?
- David seemed to be having a bad day when he wrote Psalm 14, JD likened him to that uncle that never seems happy and doesn’t have anything good to say about anybody. He even proclaimed, “no one is good!”
  - How do you react to that?
- After preaching a similar sermon in Indiana, JD was confronted by two of the congregants with the statement “You don’t have a very high opinion of humanity do you?”
  - What is your opinion of humanity?
  - Did this sermon change your opinion of humanity at all?
- JD gives another opinion of Peter’s denials. He suggested that Peter denied Jesus because he was offended by the truth. He was offended by the need of Jesus that we all have. He didn’t want to be associated with those that need redemption.
  - What do you think about that?
  - How do you see Peter’s denials?
- Jesus tells the story of the lost sheep and that we are the lost sheep and we cannot find our own way home.
  - What do you think, do you believe you can find your way home without Jesus?
- JD points out that we need to go out and celebrate Jesus finding us. That since we can’t do it ourselves, and Jesus was willing to do it, we should let the world know!
