Why is it important biblically for Dundee to become a church OF Small Groups rather than a church WITH Small Groups?

Dundee wants a strong community group ministry like the model of the early church, which met constantly, eating and studying God's word together, as well as attending worship. This was the heart of the new church – not just another program the church created. This model could withstand what the world threw at them, working alongside each other, spreading the gospel and helping those in need. It's also a way to bridge a gap between worship services, letting members meet and grow with those at a different Sunday service.

How is a Small Group more than a Bible Study?

We pray a Community Group will foster relationships and growth, as we work together. More than just studying the Bible, a Small Group cares for each other through good and bad times, learning from each other and serving together. We pray we'll become more accountable, with brothers and sisters in Christ concerned for us and helping us make good choices.

Why is it important for ALL Dundee members to be part of a Community Group?



We want people to be in community and know they are not alone in the world. It's great to see everyone lifting each other up, learning about Christ together, praying for one another, engaging in each other's lives, as well as the life of Dundee Church. We hope this ministry creates a sense of belonging that spreads beyond church walls to family, friends and neighbors so God's Kingdom grows in Omaha and worldwide.

How does Dundee's Small Group ministry fit into its Mission ministry?

We don't want to be believers who separate ourselves from the world, but rather go out into the world together. We'd love to see Community Groups serving together, sharing not only Christ with the lost, but also together growing their own relationship with Jesus and each other. It could be adopting a Dundee Mission partner or working with different Mission partners. Our purpose is clear: Growing in relationship with Christ and each other by giving everyone the opportunity to work together as brothers and sisters in Christ.
