A Note from your DPC Nurses:

Blood Pressure Sunday is held here the second Sunday of the month here at DPC. *Today is the day!*

We wanted to share why it is important for you to know what your blood pressure is. Your blood pressure is the pressure that exists within our arteries and drives blood throughout our body. At normal levels, your heart creates enough blood pressure to pump blood to vital organs like your eyes and your kidneys. Over time elevated blood pressure can hinder blood flow and can cause organ damage which can eventually increase the risk of blood clots, heart disease, stroke, heart attack and kidney disease. Blood pressure is written in two numbers. The top number is the systolic pressure (when your heart beats) and the bottom number is the diastolic pressure (when your heart is at rest between heart beats). Normal blood pressure is below 120/80 and high blood pressure or "hypertension" is when your blood pressure is consistently over 140/90. No one knows exactly what causes most cases of high blood pressure. It cannot be cured, but it can be managed. High blood pressure usually has no signs of symptoms that is why it has been dubbed the "silent killer."

People who are at high risk to have high blood pressure are people with close blood relatives who have high blood pressure, people over the age of 35, overweight people, people who are not physically active, people who consume too much salt, people who drink too much alcohol, people with diabetes, gout or kidney disease. Pregnant women, women who take birth control pills or women that have a history of high blood pressure during pregnancy. Race can factor in, African American people are more prone to having high blood pressure.

It is also important to note that sometimes people can have too low of a blood pressure and that too can cause harm.

The only way to know your blood pressure is to have your blood pressure taken by a medical professional. We are glad to do that today for you and assist in guiding you toward better health. If you have any questions you will find us in the office right next J.D.'s office. We will be there from 10-11AM and after Noon.
