A WORD FROM REV. GEORLETT

At Koinonia on Wednesday nights here at Dundee Presbyterian Church, I'm leading an adult Bible study of the book of Acts. While the official full title of that book is "The Acts of the Apostles," in class a couple of weeks ago, I was quick to point out that the book ought to be called "The Acts of the Holy Spirit" because that's the One who is really doing the work.

In either and in both cases, we should never make the mistake of assuming that these "Acts," whether of the apostles or of the Holy Spirit, are completely contained in this one book of the Bible.

Instead, as we read about what God did in those years through the lives of the apostles, we are supposed

to be inspired and very excited about what the Holy Spirit could still do in and through all of us. There is no limit to what God could do right here and right now.

Whenever I am asked how people can pray for me, I always try to remember to pray for this to be a Holy Spirit church and for me to be filled with the Holy Spirit.

Then I say, "If God would do that, everything else will be just fine." Churches are always trying to do new things, but true Christian Churches are also trying to an old thing. We're trying to be a part of the Acts of the Holy Spirit in our world.

The low-impact, weight-bearing and aerobic - yet relaxing - exercise became a martial art. It involves slow, gentle movements, deep breathing and meditation.

Many believe Tai Chi improves the flow of energy through the body, leading to several benefits, especially for older adults, including:

- Reduced pain and stiffness
- Better balance
- Weight loss
- Reduced stress
- Prevention of heart disease
- Alleviated anxiety and depression
- Improved immune function
- Better bone density
- Enhanced sleep
- Greater awareness, calmness and sense of well being, among many other benefits

Dundee's Tai Chi classes will continue this spring Monday, Friday and Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m., and on Tuesday mornings from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. All classes are held in the Underground.
